Discover the many connections between the War of 1812 and members of the Lewis and Clark Expedition's Corps of Discovery

Lorna Hainesworth will present an illustrated talk about members of the Lewis and Clark Expedition's Corps of Discovery who had significant life experiences during the War of 1812, which is defined as beginning with the 1807 Embargo Act and ending with the Treaties at Portage des Sioux in 1815. Lorna's presentation also includes persons closely associated with the Corps of Discovery who had War of 1812 experiences. She will use contemporary maps to describe events of the war and show current-day photographs of some of the places where members of the Lewis and Clark Expedition were known to have served.
