

Oregon Chapter Receives Grants

Our chapter has recently received funding from L&C Trail Stewardship Endowment for two projects: \$5,000 for signage at Blue Lake Park and \$500 to update the 2001 "L&C on the Columbia" tourism map. Both are

follow-ups to previous chapter efforts. At Blue Lake Park, in 2005 we commissioned and installed monumental art honoring the site of the Nichaqwli village which Clark visited. The location needs route signage

to guide visitors to it. And the tourism map, developed 10 years ago by Ted Kave and LCBO with help from our chapter, needs updating to reflect all the new interpretation put in place during the Bicentennial.

Keith Hay's National Honor

Our chapter's founder, Keith Hay, recently received the Meritorious Achievement Award from the national L&C foundation. His seminal work in 1962-66 with the Dept. of Interior to map the L&C trail across 10 states led to the creation of the L&C National Historic Trail, and thus to the foundation and this chapter. On his retirement he moved to Oregon and re-launched this chapter, leading it as our president and then as a director until just last year. He wrote the guide to the L&C Columbia River

Water Trail (dedicating the royalties to our chapter) and served as vice-president of Lewis & Clark Bicentennial in Oregon. Congrats, Keith!
