


We recently learned we were successful in receiving a National Parks Foundation Grant to fund and install Agents games in the Louisville/Clarksville and Mouth of the Columbia regions. Over the winter we will be working with teams in these regions to install the game at sites including Fort Clatsop, Seaside, Cape Disappointment, Falls of the Ohio, Historic Locust Grove, and the Frazier Museum.
