This Georgian mansion tells the story of its owners, William and Lucy Clark Croghan, and the story of American beginnings. William and Lucy Clark Croghan and Lucy's brother, General George Rogers Clark, welcomed a generation of American luminaries to their home to rest, dialogue, campaign, and duel. Presidents James Monroe and Andrew Jackson, John James Audubon, Cassius Marcellus Clay, and Lewis and Clark—among others—all passed through Locust Grove. Now a National Historic Landmark, Locust Grove is a unique example of early Kentucky architecture, craftsmanship, and history.

Wilkinson (1757-1825) was one of the most duplicitous, avaricious, and altogether corrupt figures in the early history of the United States. Although he served in the Revolutionary War as adjutant general under General Horatio Gates, he took an oath of allegiance to Spain in 1787, and was paid by the Spanish government. In 1803, he was appointed governor of Louisiana Territory above the 33rd parallel—the northern boundary of the present state of Louisiana. —Joseph A. Mussulman



New National Award Announced

At the Annual Meeting in Charlottesville, the Lewis & Clark Trail Alliance (LCTA) announced the establishment of a new organizational award. After consulting with the Awards Committee and the Executive Committee, the Board of Directors voted to name it the Townsend-Ritten Award after two long-time volunteers. The award will be presented from time to time to deserving individuals who have engaged in exemplary volunteer service to our organization over an extended period of time.

Kris Townsend has for several years served the organization in many roles, most importantly as a technology advisor and webmaster. He masterminded and implemented redesign and integration of our three websites: Discovering Lewis & Clark (lewis-clark.org), which provides historical knowledge and perspectives about the Expedition; our main website (lewisandclark.org), which provides an online presence for our membership efforts; and our newest site, the Lewis and Clark Trail Experience (lewisandclark.travel), which assists members, affiliates, and the public in traveling the trail and enjoying all it has to offer. Kris has been integral in providing pictorial, editorial, and technological expertise to these sites as well as to social media and to our new mobile phone app. Kris lives with his wife Joann in Spokane, Washington.
